Employment Training Panel Approves Nearly \$9M to Train California Workers

SACRAMENTO – The California Labor and Workforce Development Agency’s Employment Training Panel (ETP) approved a total of 41 contracts worth \$9M in job training funds at its last meeting of the fiscal year, today. Also awarded in June by the Panel Chair and Executive Director was approximately \$2M in small business projects, approved in the amounts of \$50K or less.

The meeting concluded a challenging but successful year for the Panel. Despite significantly diminished resources, the Panel was able to approve \$6.2M for 57 unfunded projects remaining after monies were exhausted in the 2009/10 FY and approximately \$25M for 131 new projects.

In a new “job creation” category of training proposals, ETP awarded nearly \$8M for 38 projects to support creation of up to 4,456 new jobs. Industries served ranged from electric vehicle manufacturers, green/clean technology, healthcare, aerospace/defense, and bioscience. Proposals qualifying under this category of funding were required to demonstrate the role of training as it related to job growth.

By partnering also with other state agencies such as the California Energy Commission, leveraging Governor’s discretionary 15% Workforce Investment Act dollars, and placing funding caps on projects, the Panel was able to approve projects to support job creation, small business, multiple employer contractors, healthcare and alternative and renewable energies projects.

“The ongoing demand for ETP program resources reflects the importance of workforce training for California’s employers. The Employment Training Panel is committed to supporting the State’s economic revitalization by helping to ensure the competitiveness of California’s workers and businesses,” said Executive Director, Brian McMahon.

ETP is a business and labor supported state agency that assists employers in strengthening their competitive edge by providing funds to partially off-set the costs of job skills training that are necessary to maintain high-performance workplaces. California’s ETP is a performance-based program, providing funds for trainees who successfully complete approved training programs and are retained in well-paying jobs for a specific period of time.

The program is funded by the Employment Training Tax paid by California employers and targets firms threatened by out-of-state and international competition. Since its inception in 1983, the ETP program has provided close to \$1.25 billion to train approximately 760,000 workers for more than 77,000 California companies. Employers match training funds awarded through ETP contracts, making these projects true public-private partnerships.
