EXECUTIVE REPORT

As of May 2025, ETP has approved a total of 232 proposals, valued at \$72 million dollars. Collectively, these proposals benefit over 57,000 training. Since July 2024, thousands of Californians have completed ETP funded training and secured full-time employment in roles utilizing their new skills.

ETP has put in great effort to support those who need assistance the most, so I want to make special mention of the 32 approved proposals targeting High Unemployment Areas (HUAs). As a result, around 3,500 trainees have been approved under this program, and the funding allocated to HUAs totals \$4.8 million dollars. Additionally, our staff put out another round of SEED funding, called "SEED 2.5" that provided \$1 million dollars to five grantees in support of the entrepreneurship of immigrants and limited English proficient individuals. Seventy-six percent of today's proposals are from repeat contractors. In addition, 59% are in the priority industry sector of manufacturing, and 47% are from small businesses, while 29% are from High Unemployment Areas.

We also successfully disbursed \$1 million dollars in Paid Family Leave (PFL) and partnered with the California Energy Commission (CEC), to provide \$2.7 million dollars in funding to support electric vehicle infrastructure training and certification.

Proposal Highlights

Now, for our final panel meeting for this fiscal year, we have 32 proposals. If approved, ETP will award approximately \$9.5 million dollars. Other quick stats--

- 69% are from repeat contractors,
- 50% fall within the priority industry sector of manufacturing.
- 28% represent small businesses, and
- 31% originate from High Unemployment Areas.

In addition to the proposals there is a proposed amendment for Butte-Glenn Community College District. Butte's work is crucial in the current moment as it corresponds to the Governor's Climate and Clean Energy goals. If approved, this amendment will aid this District's effort to provide a rapid workforce response for utility arborist companies that play a critical role in California's biomass, wildfire mitigation, and clean energy goals.

Today's panel packet features two proposal formats. There's a reason for that: the applications received before January 1, 2025, follow the former proposal template, and those received on or after January 1, 2025, are in compliance with SB-1321, which became effective January 1, 2025.

LEGISLATIVE REPORT

We are currently in year one of the 2025-2026 legislative session, with June 6, 2025, being the next significant legislative deadline, which is the last day for each house to pass bills introduced in that house.

In the Panel packet there are several bills that we would like to bring to your attention.

AB-765, which is the bill that would prohibit moneys in the employment training fund from being diverted, transferred, or otherwise used to pay interest charged on federal loans or related liabilities, without the approval of the Legislature by statute, and a public report justifying the necessity for the diversion, transfer or use.

On April 2, 2025, AB-765 was referred to the Committee on Insurance, currently we cannot speculate on its status. ETP remains agnostic in its position, and your legal unit will continue to monitor.

AB-1186, which would expand and clarify data collection categories regarding race and ethnicity, as well as establish a new "Chief Statistician" position. Legal unit will continue to track this and advise.

SB-470, also makes amendments to the Government code, this bill extends Bagley-Keene provisions regarding teleconference public meetings. So, the extension would be from January 1, 2026, to January 1, 2030.

REPORT OF THE CHIEF DEPUTY DIRECTOR

Regarding Funding:

- Today's Panel meeting is for approximately \$9.5 million dollars. It includes five approved Delegation Orders for a total of \$214,032.
- Delegation Orders are proposals capped at \$75K and approved under the delegated authority of the Executive Director on a continuous flow basis.
- For this state fiscal year, ETP has approved a total of 29 delegation orders.
- If all proposals scheduled for this Panel Meeting are funded today, the Panel will be approving 32 projects.

Regarding Demand and Allocations:

- There are 225 applications currently in demand
- 107 applications are with the Regional Offices in development
- 28 applications are under review with the Applications and Assessment Unit
- 80 submitted applications are pending review

The estimated value of the 225 applications is \$119.4 million and breaks down as follows:

- \$31.8 million in demand for single employer contracts
- \$13.6 in demand for small business
- \$73.6 million in demand for multiple employer contracts
- \$394,800 million for apprenticeships

We are currently within our total allocations for this fiscal year 2024-25.

Angela explained that there is a different larger warehouse staff, no courses are repeated.

Panel commented that there is an easy fix just create a sequence of courses showing advancement (102,102) and put it in the curriculum that way.

They are adding a union supported occupation to job number 2. And they are requesting a retroactive date of March 1, 2024, for reimbursement of training hours which have already been committed.

Panel asked about retroactive date.

Annie Rafferty explained the union letter of support which is where the retroactive date is coming from. March 1, 2024, is when the training started and they are at 132% of contract.

ACTION: Member Smiles moved to approve Butte Glenn Community College District as presented with the retroactive date of March 1, 2024. Member Hill Seconded. All Panel Members present voted in the affirmative for approval as moved.

Review of pilots and guidelines given by Elisabeth Testa

We have been engaged in a comprehensive review of all our pilots and guidelines are required by our legislation. There are two action items to address.

Item one, changes to the Veterans Guideline which committee approved and have been brought here for approval are as follows. A quick clean-up of the Veterans Guidelines for punctuation and grammar. Removing all references to the Retraining Job Creation program which was discontinued. Making sure all references to any contracts, forms or other references are correct and not outdated. Giving priority funding to all projects with a veteran component to ensure that veterans receive the highest reimbursement rate.

Staff requested a motion to approve the revised draft of the Veterans Guidelines.

ACTION: Member Newsom moved to approve the revised draft of the Veterans Guidelines. Member Hill Seconded. All Panel Members present voted in the affirmative for approval as moved.

Item two, are changes to the Ex Offender at Risk Youth Guidelines. Changes include a general clean-up of punctuation and grammar. A name change to Justice Involved Opportunity Youth Guidelines, which will align us with the wider labor agency terminology. An adjustment to what is considered full-time work for this population from 30 hours to 35 hours per week. Previously all trainees were held to the new hire wage now all trainees in this program will meet whatever wage is relevant to their population. With the additional option that contractors may request a lower wage if they have sufficient justification which will be subject to Panel approval. We are allowing life skills training along with basic and literacy skills training at a maximum of 50% of the training curriculum. And expanding priority funding to all projects with a Justice Involved Youth component.

Staff requested a motion to approve the revised Justice Involved Opportunity Youth Guidelines.

ACTION: Member Newsom moved to approve the revised draft of the Justice Involved Opportunity Youth Guidelines. Member Smiles Seconded. All Panel Members present voted in the affirmative for approval as moved.
