EXECUTIVE REPORT

Welcome to our third panel meeting of the 2025–26 fiscal year.

Today's meeting plays a critical role in funding and advancing apprenticeship training across California. Apprenticeships are essential for California's future growth, so we're glad to support this effort and appreciate all who are assembled here who doing phenomenal work in this space.

Additionally, I'm excited to share that the \$7.5 million for the Social Entrepreneurs for Economic Development (SEED) funding, which I mentioned in last month's panel meeting, is progressing along. We anticipate that the interagency agreement between ETP and GO-Biz will be executed in the next month.

With over \$17 million awarded since its launch, SEED has seen strong success. The SEED program supports immigrants and Limited English Proficient (LEP) entrepreneurs facing employment barriers. This grant will help businesses strengthen workforce training and talent pipelines in high-growth industry sectors, so stay tuned for more updates on how to apply.

Closed Contracts Highlights

We often state that ETP works because of the partnerships that support workforce development, so this panel meeting, I have some exciting news to highlight. Since July 2025, ETP has successfully closed 64 contracts, in which contractors earned a total of \$16.7 million dollars. As a result, 13,607 trainees have successfully completed their training and met all the post-retention wage requirements.

Of these contracts:

- 10 were Multiple Employers (MEC),
- 18 were Apprenticeships (APPR),
- 21 were Single Employer Contracts (SECs),
- 13 were Small Businesses (SB), and
- 2 were Critical Proposals (CPs).

I want to applaud everyone for these outstanding results.

Proposal Highlights

Speaking of proposals, for this panel meeting, we have 93 that have been submitted for review, including five delegations. If approved, ETP will award approximately \$25.3 million dollars:

- 83% of these are from repeat contractors.

The proposals will be presented for review and action by Willie Atkinson.

Presentations

Today, we are pleased to feature two important presentations. First, Willie Atkinson and Michele Irwin from ETP's Assessment & Program Division will share a video and PowerPoint, highlighting the real impact of apprenticeship programs across the state.

Then, we'll hear from Juanita Davis of Tradeswomen, Inc., who will speak on advancing equity and access for women in the skilled trades.

LEGISLATIVE REPORT

The California Legislature is finishing-up Year One of the 2025-2026 legislative session. Two weeks ago (September 12, 2025) was the last day for each house to pass bills; and October 12, 2025 will be the last day for the Governor to sign or veto bills passed by the legislature.

There is a copy of our current Legislation Memorandum in the Panel Packet. In there, you can see what bills remain active, and which ones did not move past the September 12 deadline. Of particular note:

AB-765, which starts at the bottom of page three of the Legislation Memorandum, which is the bill that would prohibit moneys in the Employment Training Fund from being diverted, transferred, or otherwise used to pay interest charged on federal loans or related liabilities, did not pass the Legislature and will not be moving forward this year.

SB-470, which is toward the bottom of page six, is a bill that would effectively extend those Bagley-Keene provisions regarding teleconferenced public meetings from January 1, 2026, to January 1, 2030. This bill remains active. SB-470 passed the Legislature, and was presented to the Governor on September 16, 2025, and is still waiting for the Governor's response.

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY UPDATE

Under our Cal-E-Force System, we have a couple of new internal and external efficiencies.

New Efficiencies

- Report -Training Opportunities
 - We produce reports on our website called Training Opportunities – this report is updated after each Panel meeting and provides a listing of active ETP contracts conducting training, which can be valuable for employers or for unemployed individuals interested in obtaining training.
 - These reports often took several days of manual work and now are automating data from our system, saving staff time and getting the information posted sooner.
- Invoicing Enhancement
 - An invoicing feature was also added to expedite the mass drop trainee process at close out, assisting our Payment Management Unit in the invoice closeout process.

External

- Externally, the online form called ‘Get Support’ was simplified for our customers by cutting the number of questions in half and still getting the information staff needed to provide support.

Application Workgroup

- This group continues to make strong progress and is collaborating with the Policy Committee. Our last updates included a reduction of 26 questions. This round, we have taken a holistic approach by using an online whiteboard tool where we have been able to group and analyze similar questions to minimize redundancy.
- We also have some action items that will be going back to Policy Committee.

IT Strategic Plan

The ETP IT team has launched its first internal Strategic Plan. This plan focuses on aligning people, processes, and technology to work more cohesively. Looking ahead, the plan also explores future-ready solutions, including adopting Cloud Smart strategies and leveraging AI tools to better support ETP’s mission.

REPORT OF THE CHIEF DEPUTY DIRECTOR

Thank you for the opportunity to provide a summary of the Employment Training Panel’s funding. But first I want to announce and congratulate Jana Lazarewicz on her recent promotion to Chief of Program Operations.

Jana has been with ETP for over 9 years, serving within Program Operations. She brings a wealth of experience, deep institutional knowledge, and a strong commitment to

advancing ETP's mission. Her leadership, collaborative approach, and dedication to support both staff and stakeholders make her an excellent fit for this role. Welcome Jana.

Regarding Funding

- Today's Panel meeting is for approximately \$25.3 million dollars.
 - That includes 5 approved delegation orders for a total of \$209,353.
- Delegation Orders are Proposals capped at \$75,000 and approved under delegated authority by the Director on a continuous flow basis.
- If all the proposals scheduled for today's Panel meeting are approved, the Panel will fund 88 projects for a total of \$25,141,115 in the 2025–26 fiscal year.

Regarding Demand

We have 257 applications in demand totaling \$75 million.

- 148 applications are currently in development.
- 28 applications are eligibility review.
- 81 submitted applications are pending review.

Regarding Allocations

We are currently within our total allocation for this fiscal year 2025-26.

APPRENTICESHIP PRESENTATION

Willie Atkinson and Michele Irwin from ETP's Assessment & Program Division provided an update for FY 25/26: 22,208 trainees expected this fiscal year. There has also been a total of 156,042 trainees served over the last 10 years. Several apprentices gave their personal stories on the program's impact.

ACTION ON PROPOSALS

APPRENTICESHIPS

Willie Atkinson shared that across all proposals, in the attribute section, it will say priority rate, However, the priority rate only applies to the journeyworkers. The apprentices are paid at the \$22.00 an hour rate.

Additionally, when you look at the fringe benefits and wage progression sections, you will see standard template language in every proposal. What the language is saying is that ETP only funds DAS approved programs, and in order to be approved by DAS, you must include wage progression and fringe benefit language into your program standards. This means they also meet 1321.

LABORERS APPRENTICESHIPS

Member Smiles recused himself.

Willie Atkinson shared that for Tabs 1-3, in their active contracts, they do have a contract, ET24-0113 that is showing 5%. This is a Literacy Skills proposal, and they will be coming before Panel next month to talk about the challenges and successes of those projects.

Also, in Tab 3, you will see journeyworkers in the curriculum. They will be added to the occupations after Panel's approval of the proposal.

Panel reiterated that last year during the apprenticeship hearing, there were questions raised to the applicants regarding demonstration of growth in their programs and how many apprentices were being admitted over the previous year. Additionally, questions were raised around retention, graduation rates, and reports on effective outreach methods.

The application was not updated and will be, but Panel continues to maintain an interest on these issues.

Panel additionally hopes to bring to Policy Meeting a discussion on how to go about the funding effectively, efficiently, and fairly, as there were a few proposals who had splintered into multiple classifications under the same application and training program or facility.

Panel questioned what changed from last year, specifically with the Landscape Irrigation Fitters apprenticeship.

David Espinoza explained in 2024, they worked laborers 86 million man hours in the whole state, and from training, did over 832,000 training hours. In 2024, they graduated 1,666 graduates.

Panel followed up asking, specifically to the Landscape Irrigation Fitters, how many apprentices were in the program.

David Espinoza shared they graduated 33 last year.

Panel was concerned around the total number of apprentices within all entities and having this fund of money stretched across all different entities.

Willie Atkinson explained the numbers you saw in the proposal were not the actual number they have submitted for their need. To right-size everyone, a lower number was used, and the hours were manipulated.

Panel suggested some form of working group that will eventually go to Policy, as they don't want future hearings to hear manipulation of numbers or wrong numbers were before them.

Tony Hernandez shared that since the inception of the program with ETP back in 2010, they have always made 100% at the end. Challenges included cost of goods, services, and others.

Each of the organizations works robustly with the community such as with Prisoners in Action. They also do this with their CBOs which include Rising Sun and Mandela just to name a few.

Panel questioned whether all courses under the proposals were approved standards under DAS.

Tony Hernandez explained that the courses in question are under their journey level advancement training and were included because whatever trade you are in, you have the ability to take any other training.

Willie Atkinson explained that everything was listed, because they don't separate out what is in the program standards and what is ancillary training. They are allowed to do both as it is a general assumption that they may or may not train on everything.

Panel suggested in the future to call out the difference of the journeyworker curriculum and apprentice curriculum to help with more clarity for everyone.

Tony Hernandez also shared there are 2,071 apprentices for Carpenters, 233 apprentices for Scaffolding, 187 apprentices for Pile Drivers, 915 apprentices for Drywall, and 123 apprentices for Acoustical.

Panel asked if they participated as carpenters with Women Build Nations.

Anthea Demarcos from Tab 36 thanked Panel for all previous years' of funding and shared about sending 25 delegates to the Tradeswomen Build Nations Conference last week. She also runs their mentorship group called EMPOWER which stands for ETI Mentorship Program Offering Women Extra Resources, which is designed to recruit and retain women in their locals. They also run their VEEP program which stands for Vetern Electrical Entry Program which is direct entry into their apprenticeship for Veterans. Lastly, she shared about their large diverse population.

Chris Tillery from Tab 29 shared about the impact ETP funds have had on their apprenticeship program. Their program spanning 17 counties currently has 472 apprentices. By the end of the program, these journeymen and journeywomen are making over \$52.00 per hour as well as receiving a pension and full medical, dental, and vision coverage. Students also earn college units to American River College towards an Associate's after they complete the program, and ETP funding allows them to pay for the textbooks and provide the trainees a set of hand tools for their first day on the job. Funding also allows them to do community outreach around the greater Sacramento area, last year attending or hosting 57 events. This year, they are slated for 76. Lastly, they are sending 11 delegates to the Women in Construction Conference in town.

Kevin Johnson from Tab 31 shared they currently have 678 active apprentices in their program. In their Inside Wire, they have 24 females, 12% Veterans, with 73 active inside the apprenticeship, 57% Hispanic, and 31% Caucasian. They also have had 47 graduates complete the VEEP program. Lastly, they have a CCJ pre-apprenticeship in partnership with San Diego Workforce Partnership that has 408 total graduates with 22 cohorts and have over 74% gain employment.
