Employment Training Panel Approves Approximately \$8M to Train California Workers

SACRAMENTO – The California Labor and Workforce Development Agency’s Employment Training Panel (ETP) approved 26 contracts, worth approximately \$8.5M in job training funds, at today’s panel meeting. Also in the month of December, Panel Chair, Barry Broad and Executive Director, Brian McMahon, are expected to approve another estimated \$1.6M for more than 20 small businesses and small-scope projects through the Panel’s delegation order process.

Projects approved today included incumbent worker and new hire training in both single employer contracts and Multiple Employer Contracts (MECs). Among MEC projects was a new hire training proposal from Northern California Construction & Training, Inc. (NCCT), a non-profit, building trades pre-apprenticeship program dedicated to the preparation of individuals for entry into a variety of construction trades apprenticeship programs.

According to NCCT, employers consistently emphasize the need for new hire employees who demonstrate employability skills such as good attendance, teamwork, safety, skill with tools, and rudimentary knowledge of construction materials and methods as well as construction math. Under the proposal approved today, NCCT has committed to train individuals with multiple barriers to employment – including mental or physical disability, illiteracy, limited English proficiency, limited math skills, or similar impediments. Upon completion of training, trainees will be placed with employers in the construction trades, where there is demonstrated demand.

“ETP is pleased to support training to develop the skills that will better prepare disadvantaged individuals for careers in the construction trades,” said Brian McMahon, ETP Executive Director.

ETP is a business and labor supported state agency that assists employers in strengthening their competitive edge by providing funds to partially off-set the costs of job skills training that are necessary to maintain high-performance workplaces. California’s ETP is a performance-based program, providing funds for trainees who successfully complete approved training programs and are retained in well-paying jobs for a specific period of time.

The program is funded by the Employment Training Tax paid by California employers and helps businesses threatened by out-of-state and international competition. Since its inception in 1983, the ETP program has provided close to \$1.25 billion to train approximately 760,000 workers for more than 77,000 California companies.
