Employment Training Panel Approves More Than \$12.1 Million To Support Job Training and Economic Development

SACRAMENTO – The State of California’s Employment Training Panel approved 54 contracts worth over \$12.1 million in job training funds at its public meeting last Friday. Included were small business proposals and smaller-scale projects approved by the Panel on consent.

Training proposals were comprised of both single and multiple employer contracts from various industry sectors throughout the state. The funds will assist employers in strengthening their competitive edge in the economy by partially off-setting the costs of job-skills training to more than 11,000 California workers.

The ETP program is a key component to California’s economic development and recovery, providing valuable workforce-training funds to assist employers in the development of a skilled workforce. As California’s economy continues its recovery and job creation steadily increases, the demand for workforce training is expected to remain high.

In a typical year, the Panel approves on average 272 training contracts. With 213 projects already approved this fiscal year and an unprecedented surge in applications from businesses large and small in need of workforce training, the Panel has decided to convene a public planning session next month to continue its consideration of funding priorities for the remainder of the fiscal year. Stakeholders are invited to participate in the Panel’s strategic planning session to be conducted at its regularly scheduled meeting on September 19.

ETP is a state agency supported by business and labor. California’s ETP is a performance-based program, providing funds for trainees who successfully complete training and are retained in good-paying jobs at or above a required wage base for at least 90 days.

The program, funded by the Employment Training Tax paid by California employers, helps businesses remain competitive. Since its inception in 1983, the ETP program has provided approximately \$1.25 billion to train more than 800,000 workers for more than 78,000 California companies.
